They don't call it the 'City of Sails' for nothing! Auckland's surrounding harbour is packed with breathtaking beauty spots just begging to be explored and there is no better way to see these gems than on the 360 Harbour Discovery Cruise.

This unique hop-on/hop-off cruise provides you with an opportunity to visit several harbour locations all in one day! Climb to the top of volcanic Rangitoto Island, soak in the crystal blue waters at Motuihe, admire the spectacular views from North Head, or explore Kelly Tarltons' Antarctic Adventure and Underwater World.

With an all day cruise pass you can hop-on or hop-off at any of the scheduled stops and there's also the option to catch any of the Fullers ferry services from Devonport or Rangitoto Island back to Auckland.

- **Torpedo Bay** - Hop-off here for the Navy Museum, North Head and Devonport. An Auckland - Torpedo Bay return fare also available (Returns to Auckland using the Fullers service from Devonport Wharf).
- **Royal New Zealand Navy Museum** - Discover the rich and interesting history of the Royal New Zealand Navy, entry is FREE! Enjoy lunch at the adjacent Torpedo Bay Cafe.
- **North Head** - Climb to the top for sweeping views of the Gulf. Discover a series of fascinating World War tunnels, gun emplacements and searchlights.
- **Devonport Village** - A short walk from Torpedo Bay, you'll find the laid back seaside village of Devonport. A plethora of art galleries, pubs, cafes and antique stores make it an ideal place to relax and unwind.
- **Rangitoto Island** - Climb to the top for spectacular views of the harbour, explore the popular lava caves (you'll need a torch!), or visit the WWII controlled mine base and other points of geological interest.

- **Motuihe Island** - Showcasing two magnificent white sand beaches, breath-taking landscapes and exquisite views, Motuihe is truly a heaven on earth. A perfect place for swimming, a picnic and bird-watching.

- **Orakei Wharf** - Hop-off here for Kelly Tarltons' and Mission Bay. You can return to Downtown Auckland via the free Kelly Tarltons shuttle, or public bus services departing from Mission Bay (fare additional).

- **Kelly Tarlton's Antarctic Encounter and Underwater World** - Explore the original *Underwater World* which features giant stingrays, sharks, turtles and more. Then have an *Antarctic Encounter* with New Zealand's only tuxedo-clad birds - the sub-Antarctic penguins (admission price is additional).

- **Mission Bay** - Further along from Kelly Tarltons' lies the seaside suburb of Mission Bay. Popular with locals during the summer months, Mission Bay epitomises all the elements of a Kiwi summer's day out; a striking stretch of beach packed with restaurants, bars, cafes, ice-cream parlours and more.

Rotoroa Island

...AN ISLAND APART

Nestled among a chain of islets off Waiheke's east coast is Rotoroa Island. For over 100 years the island was off limits to all but those going there for alcohol or drug rehabilitation in the care of the Salvation Army.

Now operated by the Rotoroa Island Trust, the island re-opened to the public on 27 February 2011, thanks to the generosity of philanthropists Neal and Annette Plowman, who negotiated a 99-year lease to allow public access and the island's redevelopment.

Just a 75 minute trip from Auckland, Rotoroa's features unclude beautiful beaches, walking trails, heritage buildings, and a state-of-the-art exhibition centre which tells the story of the island's history.

Explore the heart of the old Salvation Army settlement, including the jail, chapel and school house. Visit the island's exhibition centre detailing the island's unique history and conservation programme. Swim or picnic at one of four beautiful sandy beaches, or explore walking trails among regenerating bush. For more information on Rotoroa, go to www.rotoroa.org.nz

Tiritiri Matangi Island

...EXOTIC NATIVE WILDLIFE

A world renowned bird sanctuary, Tiritiri Matangi Island is a magical place which will leave you mesmerised. Heavily farmed for 120 years, it has now become one of the world's most successful volunteer conservation projects. It has been re-vegetated with around 300,000 native trees and consequently 12 of New Zealand's endangered birds and 3 reptile species have been re-introduced.

See kokako, North Island saddleback, kakariki, little spotted kiwi, stitchbird (hihi), takahe and much more in their natural environment and listen to the serenade of birdsong while relaxing at one of the many rest stations along the walkways. For an additional \$5, experience a guided walk provided by the *Supporters of Tiritiri Matangi* and learn all about this perfect island and her wildlife.
